

SUBJECT: PUBLIC HEARING FOR CASES 03-12G AND 03-13G, CONCERNING Lot 6, SQUARE 882, LOCATED ALONG M STREET SE AT 6^{TR} STREET

This letter is to inform you that the Marine Corps continues to be concerned about the redevelopment of Lot 6, Square 882 as previously noted in our letter to you dated April 3, 2009. We have met several times with the Capper/Carrollsburg Venture, LLC, and representatives of the Washington Navy Yard, District of Columbia Planners and Housing Authority representatives to discuss possible solutions. Although the Navy has indicated in their letter to you dated June 1, 2009 that proposed mitigation measures (as amended) for their Anti-terrorism/Force Protection (AT/FP) issues will satisfy their concerns, the Marine Corps will not realize satisfaction by these proposals.

The Marine Corps AT/FP issues are much greater in scope than those of the Navy. Because our issues are more complex, considerable analysis and study is required to develop a solution that is acceptable to the Marine Corps, the Developer, the Housing Authority and the District Planners. This detailed study must also be conducted in context of the larger community of stakeholders and historic integrity of the Marine Barracks as an Institution. The Marine Corps has implemented a master planning effort to research and develop broad and unique solutions to these issues at hand. We are beginning preparation of this study and will engage all stakeholders.

As noted in the Navy's June 1, 2009 letter, the Navy and the Marine Corps were not properly notified of this zoning request. Additionally, recent AT/FP issues have been identified that were not known in 2004 which require a more prudent and all encompassing approach to addressing our concerns.

The Marine Corps requires additional time to carry out our study and to develop acceptable solutions. Without adequate time to address these issues, including the possible need for alternatives on Lot 6 Square 882, the Marine Barracks Mission and full function of that Institution could be jeopardized.

The Marine Corps requests the record be re-opened and this action be tabled until adequate time is given to fully address all issues with the development of the proposed master plan.
